

Keeping of Bees

Bees may be kept without permission in a Gisborne Urban Area Residential Zone (mainly Gisborne City) if:

- The property where the bees will be kept has an area greater than 600m².
- Only 1 beehive on a property with an area of between 600m² and 900m².
- A maximum of 2 beehives on a property with an area of 900 m² or more.
3 beehives may be kept on a property with an area of 900 m² or more except where there are no dwellings or sensitive uses on adjoining properties.

Bees may be kept without permission within other Residential Zones (mainly rural townships) if:

- A maximum of 2 beehives on any property, except 3 beehives may be kept on any property where there are no dwellings or sensitive uses on adjoining properties.

The following conditions apply for keeping bees in all zones:

- Locate hives so as to avoid problems for your neighbours.
- Position hives so as to ensure that the primary flight path will not affect your neighbours homes or living areas.
- Place an obstruction in front of hives or elevate them to ensure that bees fly at least 2.5 metres above the ground before crossing the site boundary.
- Provide a water trough.
- Talk to your neighbours about when they are happy for you to do hive working and manipulation.
- If you split beehives already on a property, causing a greater number of beehives than that allowed, the beehives must be removed:
By the 30th of September – for beehives split between March and August;
Within 6 weeks – for beehives split between September and February.
- Hives must be constructed and maintained so as to ensure that no nuisance occurs from their existence or use.
- Parasites, flies and other pests must not reach levels that may create a nuisance to neighbours or a health risk to humans or animals.
- Bees must be located and kept so other nuisance occurs (including any activity associated with the keeping of bees including such as of honey and waste).

Note

If an Environmental Health Officer considers that any bees are being kept in a manner or position that is considered a nuisance, action may be taken which may include the destruction of bees.

Written Council permission is necessary to keep bees outside of these requirements. Please and return the application form on reverse side if permission is required.
