Pool Safety Checklist

Carry out these checks at least once a year.

If the pool has been legalised after January 2017 some of the items in the list below will not apply. Please read F9 (link above) to fully understand the requirements from 2017 onwards.

1.	Is the fence at least 1.2m high?		
2.	Are the fence palings vertical and climb-proof?		
3.	Are there any gaps greater than 100mm in the fencing?		
4.	Do gates open outwards?		
5.	Do gates shut automatically? (As per security and locking requirements)		
6.	Are gate latches self-locking?	\square	\square
7.	Are there top bolts on ranch sliders or a compliant door alarm that prevents access to the pool?	П	\square
8.	Are the steps for a Para-type pool removed when the pool is not in use?		
9.	Are any climbable objects at least 1.2m away from the pool fence as per 'climbable objects' If the pool fence is on a boundary, check the neighbour's side also.

10.	Is the pool less than 5m ² ?		
11.	Does it have a compliant lockable lid?		
12.	Is it at least 760mm high and unclimbable?		
13.	Is it 1200mm away from any climbable object?		
General Safety Issues			
14.	Does the pool surround have a non-slip surface?		
15.	Is there a first aid kit available?		
16.	Are pool chemicals stored safety?		
17.	Do you have safety signage for emergencies?
