Re: Resource Consent Application – Eastland Port Expansion

To whom it may concern,

T&G Global supports the expansion of the Eastland Port. The Port's development aligns with T&G's growth strategy and the increased export volumes of our premium Envy™ apple brand in the Gisborne and Wairoa regions, where we are working with independent growers and Iwi to help meet global consumer demand.

The option of moving cargo on coastal container ships and conventional reefer ships is the most efficient way to move cargo, reducing the carbon footprint of moving fruit to international markets.

With increased export volumes from the region, the development will reduce the number of heavy trucks required to move fruit between Gisborne and either Napier or Tauranga by road. This will help stop the degrading of road surfaces, reduce traffic volumes and enable local freight companies to minimise the need to move empty containers between Napier, Tauranga and Gisborne. It will also build increased resilience into supply chains, providing alternative forms of transport for primary sector exporters.

The Port's expansion also aligns with the New Zealand Government's Coastal Supply Chain Strategy to remove vehicles from the road and use blue water as an alternative.

Quote from Minister Wood, 2 December 2021

"We want to give businesses more choice in how they move their freight. Moving more freight by ship will also help drive down emissions, as shipping has a lower emissions per tonne-kilometre than land transport, and also reduce the number of trucks on the roads, which will improve safety and reduce congestion."

"Investing in the blue highway will make our supply chain more resilient, which is especially important given the strains that COVID-19 and global congestion have placed on it. The Kaikōura earthquake also showed how important it is to have a reliable alternative to move freight on top of road and rail."

T&G supports this application by Eastland Port.
